Carbon brushes are a wearing component of the circular saw therefore not covered under warranty. Continuing to use the circular saw when carbon brushes need to be replaced may cause permanent damage to the circular saw. Carbon brushes will wear out after many uses but when the carbon



brushes need to be replaced, take the circular saw to an electrician or a power tool repairer for a quick and low cost replacement. Always replace both carbon brushes at the same time Note: Ozito Industries will not be responsible for any

damage or injuries caused by the repair of the circular saw by an unauthorised person or by mishandling of the circular saw.

Replacing the Drive Belt

If the drive belt wears out, the belt will have to be replaced. Drive belts are a wearing component of the mini circular saw therefore not covered under warranty. The drive belt will wear out after many uses but when the belt need to be replaced, take the saw to an electrician or a power tool repairer for a quick and low cost replacement.

Sparking visible through the housing air vents

A small amount of sparking may be visible through the housing vents. This is normal and does not indicate a problem
