
vou walk forward. holding it at an angle of approx. 30° (Light cuts are better than heavy cuts as they allow the cut grass to fall away from the cutting head).





NOTE: IF THE MOTOR STARTS TO SLOW DOWN, REDUCE THE CUTTING LOAD.

13. After finishing the cutting operation, keep the head close to ground level, release the switch and allow the motor to come to a complete standstill. Unplug and place the line trimmer on the ground.
