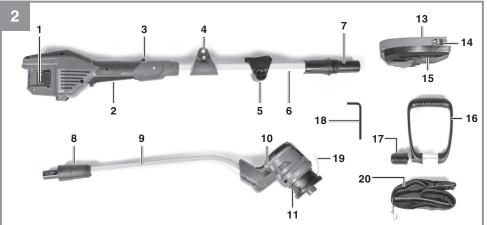


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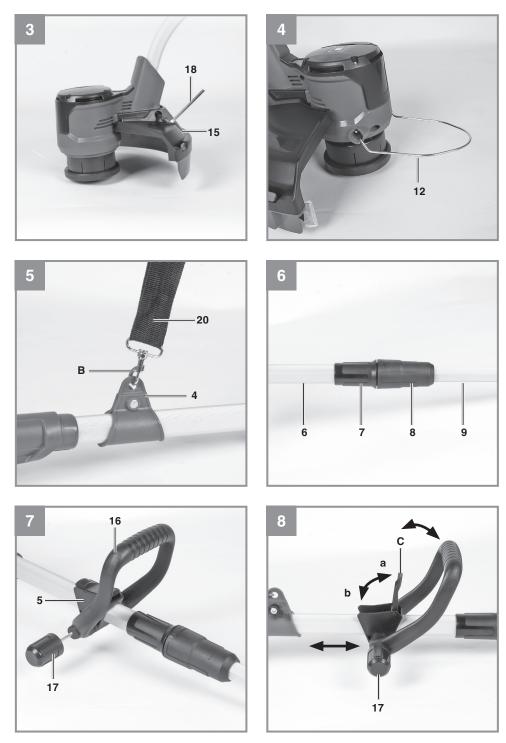
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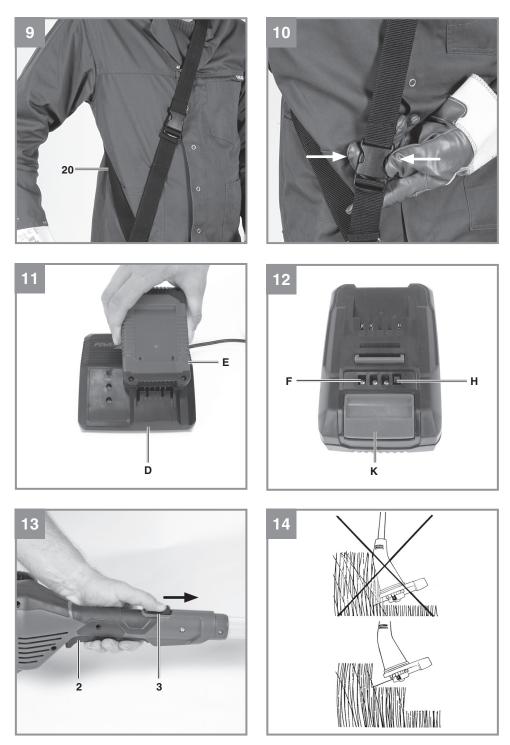
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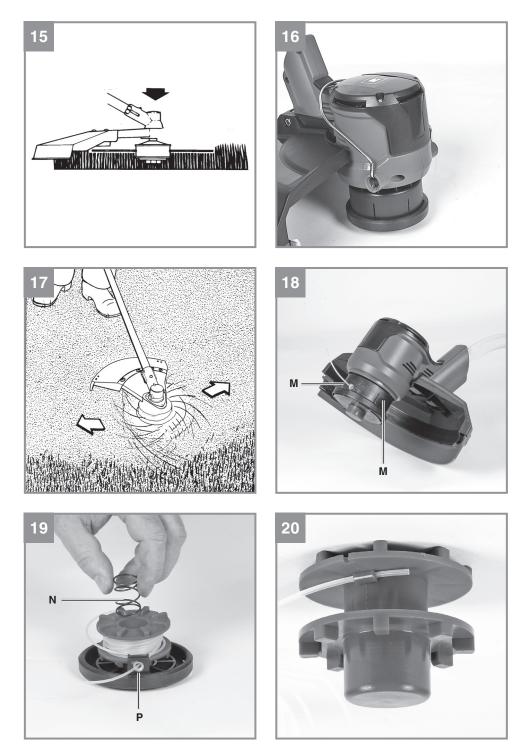
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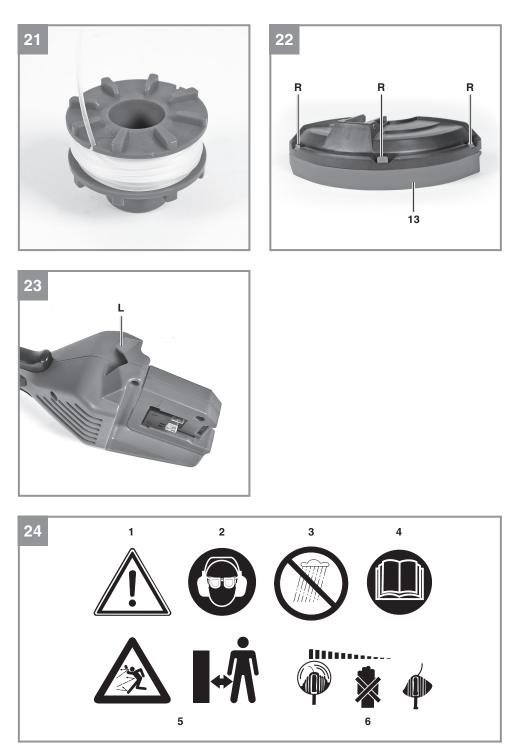
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Danger! - Read the operating instructions to reduce the risk of inquiry

This equipment is not allowed to be used by children. Children should be supervised so that they do not play with the equipment. Children are not allowed to carry out the cleaning or maintenance. 1. Safety information

General safety instructions for electric tools

Danger!

Read all the safety information and instructions. Any errors made in following the safety information and instructions set out below may result in an electric shock, fire and/or serious injury. Keep all the safety information and instructions in a safe place for future use.

The term "electric tool" used in the safety instructions refers to electric tools operated from the mains power supply (with a power cable) and to battery operated electric tools (without a power cable).

1. Workplace safety

- a) Keep your work area clean and well illuminated. Untidy or unlit work areas can result in accidents.
- b) Do not operate the electric tool in an environment where there is a risk of explosions and where there are inflammable liquids, gases or dust. Electric tools produce sparks which could set the dust or vapours alight.
- c) Keep the electric tool out of the reach of children and other persons. If there is a distraction, you may lose control of the appliance.

2. Electrical safety

a) The connector plug from this electric tool must fit into the socket. The plug should never be altered in any way. Never use adapter plugs together with earthed electric tools. Unaltered plugs and correct sockets reduce the risk of an electric shock.

- b) Avoid bodily contact with earthed surfaces such as pipes, heating, ovens and fridges. The risk of electric shock is increased if your body is earthed.
- c) Keep the tool out of the rain and away from moisture. The ingress of water into an electric tool increases the risk of an electric shock.
- d) Do not use the cable to carry the electric tool, to hang it up or to pull it out of the socket. Keep the cable away from heat, oil, sharp edges and moving parts of the appliance. Damaged or entangled cables increase the risk of an electric shock.
- e) If you are working outdoors with an electric tool, only use extension cables which are designed specifically for this purpose. Using specially designed outdoor extension cables, the risk of electric shock is reduced.
- f) If operation of the electric tool in a damp environment can not be avoided, use a earth-leakage circuit-breaker. The earthleakage circuit-breaker reduces the risk of an electric shock.

3. Safety of persons

- a) Be careful, watch what you are doing and use an electric tool sensibly. Do not use the tool if you are tired or under the influence of drugs, alcohol or medication. A moment of inattention when using the electric tool can result in serious injuries.
- b) Wear personal protection equipment and always wear safety goggles. Wearing personal protection (such as dust masks, non-slip safety shoes, safety helmet or ear protection, depending upon the type and use of the electric tool) reduces the risk of injury.
- c) Make sure that the appliance cannot start up accidentally. Ensure that the electric tool is switched off before you connect it to the power supply and/or insert the battery, or pick up or carry the tool. If your finger is on the switch whilst carrying the electric tool or if you connect the appliance to the mains when it is switched on, this can lead to accidents.
- d) Remove keys and wrenches before switching on the electric tool. A tool or key which comes into contact with rotating parts of the appliance can lead to injuries.
- e) Avoid abnormal working postures. Make sure you stand squarely and keep your balance at all times. In this way, you can

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control the electric tool better in unexpected circumstances.

- f) Wear suitable work clothes. Do not wear loose clothing or jewellery. Keep hair, clothes and gloves away from moving parts. Loose clothing, jewellery or long hair can get trapped in moving parts.
- g) If vacuuming devices and draining devices can be fitted, make sure that these are correctly attached and correctly used. The use of a dust extraction system can reduce the danger posed by dust.

4. Usage and treatment of the electric tool

- a) Do not overload the appliance. Use the correct tool for your work. You will be able to work better and more safely within the given performance boundaries.
- b) Do not use an electric tool with a defective switch. An electric tool that cannot be switched on or off is dangerous and must be repaired.
- c) Pull the plug out of the socket and/or remove the battery before making any adjustments to the appliance, changing accessories or putting the appliance down. This safety measure prevents starting the electric tool unintentionally.
- d) Keep unused electric tools out of the reach of children. Do not allow people who are not familiar with the appliance or who have not read these instructions to use the appliance. Electric tools are dangerous if they are used by inexperienced people.
- e) Clean your electric tool carefully. Check whether moving parts are functioning properly and not jamming, whether parts are broken or damaged enough that the functioning of this electric tool is affected. Have damaged parts repaired before using the appliance. Many accidents are caused by badly maintained electric tools.
- f) Keep your cutting tools sharp and clean. Carefully maintained cutting tools with sharp cutting edges will jam less and are easier to control.
- g) Make sure to use electric tools, accessories, attachments, etc. in accordance with these instructions. Take the conditions in your work area and the job in hand into account. Using electric tools for any purpose other than the one for which they are intended can lead to dangerous situations.
- 5. Using and handling the cordless toola) Only charge the batteries in chargers that

are recommended by the manufacturer. A charger that is designed for a certain type of battery may pose a fire risk if it is used with other types of battery.

- b) Use only the correct batteries in the electric tools. The use of other batteries may result in injuries and a fire risk.
- c) Keep unused batteries away from paper clips, coins, keys, nails, screws and other metallic objects that could cause a short circuit between the contacts. A short circuit between the battery contacts may cause burns or a fire.
- d) In case of incorrect use, fluid may escape from the battery. Avoid contact with it. If you touch it by accident, rinse the affected area with water. If you get the fluid in your eyes, also seek medical advice. Leaking battery fluid can cause skin irritation or burns.

6. Service

a) Have your electric tool repaired only by trained personnel using only genuine spare parts. This will ensure that your electric tool remains safe to use.

Additional safety instructions

We pay a great deal of attention to the design of every battery pack to ensure that we supply you with batteries which feature maximum power density, durability and safety. The battery cells have a wide range of safety devices. Each individual cell is initially formatted and its electrical characteristic curves are recorded. This data are then used exclusively to be able to assemble the best possible battery packs. Despite all the safety precautions, caution must always be exercised when handling batteries. The following points must be obeyed at all times to ensure safe use.

Safe use can only be guaranteed if undamaged cells are used. Incorrect handling can cause cell damage.

Important: Analyses confirm that incorrect use and poor care are the main causes of the damage caused by high performance batteries.

Information about the battery

- The battery pack supplied with your cordless tool is not charged. The battery pack has to be charged before you use the tool for the first time.
- 2. For optimum battery performance avoid low

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discharge cycles. Charge the battery pack frequently.

- Store the battery pack in a cool place, ideally at 15°C and charged to at least 40%.
- 4. Lithium-ion batteries are subject to a natural ageing process. The battery pack must be replaced at the latest when its capacity falls to just 80% of its capacity when new. Weakened cells in an aged battery pack are no longer capable of meeting the high power requirements and therefore pose a safety risk.
- 5. Do not throw battery packs into an open fire. There is a risk of explosion!
- 6. Do not ignite the battery pack or expose it to fire.
- 7. Do not exhaustively discharge batteries. Exhaustive discharge will damage the battery cells. The most common cause of exhaustive discharge is lengthy storage or non-use of partly discharged batteries. Stop working as soon as the performance of the battery falls noticeably or the electronic protection system triggers. Place the battery pack in storage only after it has been fully charged.
- Protect batteries and the tool from overloads. Overloads will quickly result in overheating and cell damage inside the battery housing without this overheating actually being apparent externally.
- 9. Avoid damage and shocks. Replace batteries which have been dropped from a height of more than one meter or which have been exposed to violent shocks without delay, even if the housing of the battery pack appears to be undamaged. The battery cells inside the battery may have suffered serious damage. In this respect, please also read the waste disposal information.
- 10. If the battery pack suffers overloading and overheating, the integrated protective cut-off will switch off the equipment for safety reasons. **Important.** Do not press the ON/OFF switch any more if the protective cut-off has actuated. This may damage the battery pack.
- Use only original battery packs. The use of other batteries may result in injuries, explosion and a fire risk.

Information on chargers and the charging process

 Please check the data marked on the rating plate of the battery charger. Be sure to connect the battery charger to a power supply with the voltage marked on the rating plate. Never connect it to a different mains voltage.

- 2. Protect the battery charger and its cable from damage and sharp edges. Have damaged cables repaired without delay by a qualified electrician.
- 3. Keep the battery charger, batteries and the cordless tool out of children's reach.
- 4. Do not use damaged battery chargers.
- 5. Do not use the supplied battery charger to charge other cordless tools.
- In heavy use the battery pack will become warm. Allow the battery pack to cool to room temperature before commencing with the charging.
- Do not over-charge batteries. Do not exceed the maximum charging times. These charging times only apply to discharged batteries. Frequent insertion of a charged or partly charged battery pack will result in over-charging and cell damage. Do not leave batteries in the charger for days on end.
- Never use or charge batteries if you suspect that the last time they were charged was more than 12 months previously. There is a high probability that the battery pack has already suffered dangerous damage (exhaustive discharge).
- Charging batteries at a temperature below 10°C will cause chemical damage to the cell and may cause a fire.
- Do not use batteries which have heated during the charging process, as the battery cells may have suffered dangerous damage.
- Do not use batteries which have suffered curvature or deformation during the charging process or which show other non-typical symptoms (gassing, hissing, cracking,...)
- Never fully discharge the battery pack (recommended depth of discharge max. 80%) A complete discharge of the battery pack will lead to premature ageing of the battery cells.
- 13. Never charge the batteries unsupervised.

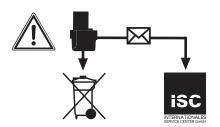
Protection from environmental influences

- 1. Wear suitable work clothes. Wear safety goggles.
- 2. Protect your cordless tool and the battery charger from moisture and rain. Moisture and rain can cause dangerous cell damage.
- 3. Do not use the cordless tool or the battery charger near vapors and inflammable liquids.
- Use the battery charger and cordless tools only in dry conditions and an ambient temperature of 10-40°C.
- 5. Do not keep the battery charger in places where the temperature is liable to reach over

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40°C. In particular, do not leave the battery charger in a car that is parked in the sunshine.

- Protect batteries from overheating. Overloads, over-charging and exposure to direct sunlight will result in overheating and cell damage. Never charge or work with batteries which have been overheated – replace them immediately if possible.
- Storage of batteries, battery chargers and cordless tools. Store the charger and your cordless tool only in dry places with an ambient temperature of 10-40°C. Store your lithium-ion battery pack in a cool, dry place at a temperature of 10-20°C. Protect them from humidity and direct sunlight. Only place fully charged batteries in storage (charged at least 40%).
- Prevent the lithium-ion battery pack from freezing. Battery packs which were stored below 0°C for more than 60 minutes must be disposed of.
- When handling batteries beware of electrostatic charge: Electrostatic discharges cause damage of the electronic protection system and the battery cells. Avoid electrostatic charging and never touch the battery poles.



Rechargeable batteries and cordless electric machines and tools contain materials that are potentially harmful to the environment. Never place any cordless electric machines or tools in your household refuse. When cordless electric machines or tools become defective or worn, remove the rechargeable batteries and return them to iSC GmbH (address: Eschenstrasse 6, D-94405, Germany). If the rechargeable batteries cannot be removed, return the complete cordless machine or tool. You can then be sure that the equipment will be correctly disposed of by the manufacturer.

When shipping or disposing of batteries and cordless tools, always ensure that they are packed individually in plastic bags to prevent short circuits and fires.

Additional safety instructions

- Before you begin your work, examine the material you want to cut. Remove any foreign bodies. Continue to watch out for foreign bodies while you are working. If you come across any foreign bodies while cutting, turn off the machine and remove the items in question.
- Work only when visibility is adequate.
- Make sure you stand squarely at all times while working. Be careful when walking backwards. Tripping hazard!
- Never leave the equipment unsupervised in the work area. If you stop work for a while, leave the equipment in a safe place.
- If you stop your work in order to go to another area to work, you must make sure that the equipment is switched off while you are going there.
- Never use the equipment while it is raining or in damp or wet surroundings.
- Protect your equipment against moisture and rain.
- Before you switch on the equipment, check that the cutting unit will not touch any stones or other objects.
- Always wear suitable working clothes to prevent injuries to the head, hands and feet. For this purpose wear a helmet, safety goggles (or visor), high boots (or strong shoes and long trousers made of tough fabric) and work gloves.
- When the equipment is in operation, you must always hold it away from your body!
- Do not switch on the equipment when it is turned around or when it is not in working position.
- Switch off the motor when the equipment is not being used, when you leave it unsupervised, when checking the equipment, when removing or replacing the spool, or when transporting the equipment from one place to another.
- Keep the equipment away from other people, especially children, and from pets. There may be stones and other objects in the grass that is cut and thrown up.
- When you are working, keep a distance of at least 5 m from other persons and pets.
- Do not cut against hard objects. This will help you to prevent causing injury to yourself and damage to the equipment.
- Use the edge of the safety guard to keep the equipment away from walls, different surfaces and fragile objects.
- Never use the equipment without the safety

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guard.

- This equipment is not allowed to be used by children or by persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capacities or those with a lack of experience and knowledge. Children should be supervised so that they do not play with the equipment. Children are not allowed to carry out the cleaning or maintenance.
- Avoid abnormal working postures. Make sure you stand squarely and keep your balance at all times. Always maintain good footing on inclines. Only operate the equipment at a walking pace.
- Risk of injury from dangerous moving parts!
- The moving parts are not allowed to be touched before the battery has been removed and all moving parts have come to a complete standstill.
- Read the directions with due care. Familiarize yourself with the operator controls and proper operation of the equipment.
- Never allow children or other persons who are not familiar with the operating instructions to use the equipment. Contact your local governmental agency for information regarding minimum age requirements for the user.
- Always keep in mind that the user of the equipment is personally responsible for accidents or hazards involving other persons or their property.
- Before use, always carry out a visual check to make sure that the safety devices or covers are not missing or damaged and that they are correctly fitted.
- Never use the equipment in bad weather conditions and particularly never when there is a risk of lightning.
- Never use the equipment with a damaged cover or safety device or when a cover or safety device is missing.
- Switch on the motor only when there are no hands or feet within range of the cutting unit.
 Always switch off the equipment and remove
- the battery
 - when you leave the equipment unsupervised.
 - before you remove a blockage.
 - before you examine, clean or work on the equipment.
 - after the equipment strikes a foreign body.
 when the equipment begins to make unusual vibrations (examine immediately).
- Risk of injury from the cutting unit! Keep hands and feet away from the cutting unit!
- Use only spare parts and accessories which

are recommended by the manufacturer.

• Examine and service the equipment regularly.

Important! The safety guard is there to ensure your safety and the safety of others. It is also essential for the equipment to work correctly. Failure to comply with this instruction will invalidate your warranty as well as create a potential source of danger.

- Never use your hands to try to stop the cutting unit. Always wait for it to stop by itself.
- Use only genuine cutting units.Make sure that the air vents are free of dirt.
- Do not try to use the equipment to cut grass which is not growing on the ground; for example, do not try to cut grass growing on
- walls or stones, etc.
 The person operating the grass trimmer is liable for any damages sustained by third parties within the equipment's working radius as a result of its use.
- Do not cross roads or gravel paths with the equipment switched on.
- When you are not using the equipment, keep it in a dry place out of the reach of children.
- Use the equipment only in the way described in these operating instructions and always hold it perpendicular to the ground. Every other position is dangerous.
- Check at regular intervals that the screws are properly tightened.
- The area to be cut must always be kept cleared of cables and other objects.
- If the equipment has to be lifted for transporting, be sure to switch off the motor first and wait for the cutter to come to a standstill. Each time you leave the equipment, switch off the motor.
- Under no circumstances are you to cut against hard objects during use. This is imperative to prevent injury to yourself and damage to the equipment.
- Use only original replacement parts for repairs.
- Before starting up the equipment, and after any collision, check the equipment for signs of wear or damage and have any necessary repairs carried out.
- Always keep your hands and feet away from the cutting unit, especially when switching the motor on.
- Unplug the rechargeable battery before checking, cleaning or doing any work on the equipment and when it is not being used.
- Acquaint yourself with the controls and how to

use the tool.

- Stop using the equipment when there are people – particularly children – or pets nearby.
- Never use the machine if protective equipment is damaged or missing.
- Never mount metal cutting elements.
- Electrically powered trimmers should be repaired only by authorized persons.
- Use only spare parts and accessories which are recommended by the manufacturer.

Important: The cutting unit continues to run for a few seconds after the motor is switched off.

The cutter continues to rotate!

2.2 Items supplied

Please check that the article is complete as specified in the scope of delivery. If parts are missing, please contact our service center or the sales outlet where you made your purchase at the latest within 5 working days after purchasing the product and upon presentation of a valid bill of purchase. Also, refer to the warranty table in the service information at the end of the operating instructions.

- Open the packaging and take out the equipment with care.
- Remove the packaging material and any packaging and/or transportation braces (if available).
- Check to see if all items are supplied.
- Inspect the equipment and accessories for transport damage.
- If possible, please keep the packaging until the end of the guarantee period.

Danger!

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3. Intended use

The equipment is designed for cutting lawns and grassed areas. It is not designed to be used for public facilities, parks, sports centers, along road-ways, or in agriculture and forestry.

The operating instructions as supplied by the manufacturer must be kept and referred to in order to ensure that the equipment is properly used and maintained.

Important. This equipment must not be used for composting purposes (shredding) as this could result in injury or damage to property.

The equipment may be used only for the tasks it is designed to handle. Any other use is deemed to be a case of misuse. The user/operator and not the manufacturer will be liable for any damage or injuries of any kind resulting from such misuse.

Please note that our equipment has not been designed for use in commercial, trade or industrial applications. Our warranty will be voided if the equipment is used in commercial, trade or industrial businesses or for equivalent purposes.

Caution!

Residual risks

Even if you use this electric power tool in accordance with instructions, certain residual risks cannot be rules out. The following hazards may arise in connection with the equipment's construction and layout:

- Lung damage if no suitable protective dust mask is used.
- Damage to hearing if no suitable ear protection is used.
- Health damage caused by hand-arm vibrations if the equipment is used over a prolonged period or is not properly guided and maintained.
- Injuries and material damage caused by flying parts.
- Cut injuries if suitable protective clothing is not worn.

Danger!

The electric power tool generates an electromagnetic field during operation. Under certain circumstances this field may actively or passively impede medical implants. Caution!

The equipment is supplied without batteries and without a charger and is allowed to be used only with the lithium-ion batteries (two batteries) of the Power-X-Change series!

The lithium-ion batteries of the Power-X-Change series are allowed to be charged only with the Power-X charger.

The machine noise might exceed 85 dB (A). The operator will require noise protection measures if this is the case. The noise is measured in accordance with EN ISO 11201:2010 and EN ISO 3744:2010. The value of the vibrations emitted by the handle was determined in accordance with EN 28662-1:1992.

Important.

The vibration value changes according to the area of application of the electric equipment and may exceed the specified value in exceptional circumstances.

Reduce noise generation and vibration to a minimum!

- Use only equipment that is in perfect condition.
- Maintain and clean the equipment regularly.
- Adapt your way of working to the equipment.
- Do not overload the equipment.
- Have the equipment checked if necessary.
- Switch off the equipment when not in use.

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• Wear gloves.

5. Before using the equipment

The equipment is supplied without batteries and without a charger!

5.1 Fitting the guard hood (Fig. 3)

Remove the socket head screw from the guard hood. Push the guard hood (15) onto the mount on the motor housing as far as it will go and screw it securely in place with the previously removed socket head screw (Fig. 3). A blade (Fig. 2/ Item 14) on the underside of the guard hood automatically cuts the cutting line to the optimum length. This is provided with a safety guard. Remove the safety guard before starting work.

5.2 Fitting the edge guide (Fig. 4)

Pull the ends of the edge guide (Item 12) slightly apart and insert the ends in the holes provided on the left and right in the motor housing.

5.3 Fitting the harness (Fig. 5)

Hook the carabiner (B) of the harness (20) into the strap attachment (4).

5.4 Fitting the long handle (Fig. 6)

Slot the top part of the long handle (6) into the bottom part of the long handle (9). Screw the handle connecting piece (7) to the bottom part of the long handle with the union nut (8) on the top part of the long handle.

5.5 Fitting the additional handle (Fig. 7)

Attach the additional handle (16) to the attachment (5) and screw both parts together with the handle screw (17).

5.6 Adjusting the additional handle (Fig. 8)a) Adjusting the tilt

- Undo the handle screw (17). Set the desired tilt of the additional handle (16). Tighten the handle screw (17) again.
- b) Shifting the additional handle
 Open (a) the lock (C) and move the additional handle to the desired position. Close (b) the lock (C).

5.7 Using the harness

The harness is intended to help you work safely and ergonomically. Always switch off the equipment before you release the harness – risk of injury.

- 1. Hook the carabiner (Fig. 5/Item B) into the strap attachment.
- Slip the harness over your left shoulder (Fig. 9).
- Set the length of the harness in such a way that the cutting head runs parallel to the ground. To establish the optimum length of the harness, you should then make a few swinging movements without starting the equipment.
- 4. The harness is equipped with a buckle. Press the hooks together (Fig. 10) if you need to put down the equipment quickly.

Each time before use, check the following :

- That the equipment is in perfect condition and that the safety devices and cutting devices are complete.
- That all screws are securely fastened.
- That all moving parts move smoothly.

5.8 Installing the battery

Push the rechargeable batteries into the battery mounts provided on the left and right on the equipment (Fig. 2/Item 1). The battery will be heard to click into place when it has been pushed fully in (Fig. 1). To take out the battery, press the pushlock button (Fig. 12/Item K) and remove the battery.

5.9 Charging the battery (Fig. 11)

- 1. Take the battery pack out of the equipment. Do this by pressing the side pushlock buttons.
- Check that your mains voltage is the same as that marked on the rating plate of the battery charger. Insert the power plug of the charger (8) into the mains socket outlet. The green LED will then begin to flash.
- 3. Insert the battery pack (7) into the battery charger (8).
- 4. In section "Charger indicator" you will find a table with an explanation of the LED indicator on the charger.

The battery pack can become a little warm during the charging. This is normal. If the battery pack fails to charge, check:

- whether there is voltage at the socket outlet
- whether there is good contact at the charging contacts

If the battery pack still fails to charge, send

- the charging unit
- and the battery pack

to our customer service center.

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To ensure that the battery pack provides long service, you should take care to recharge it promptly. You must recharge the battery pack when you notice that the power of the cordless grass trimmer drops. Never fully discharge the battery pack. This will cause it to develop a defect.

5.10 Battery capacity indicator (Fig. 12)

Press the switch for the battery capacity indicator (Item F). The battery capacity indicator (Item H) shows the charge status of the battery using 3 LEDs.

All 3 LEDs are lit:

The battery is fully charged.

2 or 1 LED(s) are lit:

The battery has an adequate remaining charge.

1 LED flashes:

The battery is empty, recharge the battery.

All LEDs flash:

The battery pack has undergone exhaustive discharge and is defective. Do not use or charge a defective battery pack.

6. Operation

Please note that the statutory regulations governing noise abatement may differ from one location to another.

Danger! The guard hood must be fitted when carrying out work.

6.1 Switching the equipment on and off, adjusting the speed (Fig. 13)

Switching on and setting the speed

Press the safety lock-off (3) forwards and press the On/Off switch (2) at the same time. Adjust the speed during operation by pressing the On/Off switch to a greater or lesser extent. The harder you push, the higher the speed.

Switching off

Release the On/Off switch.

6.2 Practical tips

Practice all the work steps with the motor switched off and without the rechargeable battery before you start to use the equipment. Only ever cut grass that is dry. If the grass is long, the grass must be cut shorter in stages (Fig. 14).

Extending the cutting line (Fig. 15)

Danger! Do not use any kind of metal wire or metal wire encased in plastic in the line spool. This may cause serious injuries to the user.

The grass trimmer has a semi-automatic line extension system (automatic jog line feed). Each time you activate the semi-automatic line extension system, the line is automatically extended to ensure that you can cut your lawn with the perfect cutting width at all times. To extend the cutting line, run the motor and tap the line spool on the ground. This will automatically extend the line. The blade on the guard hood will cut the line to the permissible length. Please note that the more often you activate the semi-automatic line extension system, the more the line will wear.

Note: If the line is too long when you use the equipment for the first time, the surplus end of it will be cut by the blade on the guard hood. If the line is too short when you start the equipment for the first time, press the knob on the line spool and pull the line hard. When you then start the machine for the first time the line will be cut to the perfect length automatically.

Using a brush or similar, carefully remove all residual grass from the underside of the guard hood at regular intervals.

Different cutting methods

Caution! To use the edge guide along walls or objects, swing the edge guide forward to the front (Fig. 4). Swing it up when not in use (Fig. 16). Please note: Even if it is used carefully, cutting around foundations, stone or concrete walls, etc. will result in the line suffering above normal wear.

Trimming/mowing

Swing the trimmer from side to side in a scything motion. Always keep the line spool parallel to the ground. Check the site and decide what cutting height you require. Guide and hold the line spool at the required height to ensure that you cut evenly.

Low trimming

Hold the trimmer right in front of you at a slight angle so that the underside of the line spool is above the ground and the line strikes the correct target. Always cut away from yourself. Never draw

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the trimmer towards yourself.

Cutting along fences/foundations Edge guide recommended!

When cutting approach wire mesh fences, lath fences, natural stone walls and foundations slowly so that you can cut close to them without striking the obstacle with the line. If, for example, the line strikes stones, stone walls or foundations, it will wear or fray. If the line strikes wire fencing it will break.

Trimming around trees Edge guide recommended!

When trimming around tree trunks, approach slowly so that the line does not strike the bark. Walk around the tree, cutting from left to right. Approach grass or weeds with the tip of the line and tilt the line spool forwards slightly. Warning: Take extreme care during mowing work. When doing such work keep a distance of 30 meters between yourself and other people or animals.

Mowing

For mowing you want to cut all the vegetation down to the ground. To do this, set the line spool at an angle of 30° to the right. Place the handle in the required position. Remember the increased risk of injury to the user, watchers and animals and the danger of damaging other items due to objects (for example stones) being thrown out (Fig. 17).

Warning: Do not remove any objects from footpaths, etc. using the equipment.

The equipment is a powerful tool and can throw small stones and other objects a distance of 15 meters or more, causing injuries and damage to cars, houses and windows.

Sawing

The equipment is not suitable for sawing.

7. Cleaning, maintenance and ordering of spare parts

Danger!

Before putting away or cleaning the grass trimmer, switch off and remove the battery pack.

7.1 Cleaning

Keep all safety devices, air vents and the

motor housing free of dirt and dust as far as possible. Wipe the equipment with a clean cloth or blow it down with compressed air at low pressure.

- We recommend that you clean the equipment immediately after you use it.
- Clean the equipment regularly with a damp cloth and some soft soap. Do not use cleaning agents or solvents; these may be aggressive to the plastic parts in the equipment. Ensure that no water can get into the interior of the equipment. The ingress of water into an electric tool increases the risk of an electric shock.
- Use a brush to remove deposits from the safety guard.

7.2 Replacing the line spool

Danger! Remove the battery packs!

- 1. Fig. 18 Press the line spool housing together at the points marked M and remove the spool cover.
- 2. Remove the empty line spool and the pression spring.
- Fig. 19 Thread the end of the line on the new line spool through the eyelet (P) in the spool cover and allow approx. 13 cm of line to project. Place the pression spring (N) in the line spool.
- 4. Press the spool cover back into the line spool housing.

7.3 Replacing the cutting line

Danger! Remove the battery packs!

- 1. Fig. 18 Press the line spool housing together at the points marked M and remove the spool cover.
- 2. Remove the empty line spool and the pression spring.
- 3. Remove any remaining cutting line if there is any.
- 4. Fig. 20 Insert the new cutting line through the line mount inside the spool.
- 5. Wind the line with tension in a counter-clockwise direction.
- Fig. 21 Hook the line, approx. 15 cm before the end of the line, into one of the line holders on the edge of the spool.
- Fig. 19 Thread the end of the line on the new line spool through the eyelet (P) in the spool cover. Place the pression spring (N) in the line spool.
- 8. Pull the line sharply to release it from the line holder.
- 9. Press the spool cover back into the line spool

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housing.

When you start the equipment again the line will be cut to the perfect length automatically.

Caution! Bits of the nylon line could cause injury when flung out.

7.4 Sharpening the guard hood blade

The guard hood blade (Fig. 2/Item 14) can become blunt over time. When you notice this, undo the screw holding the guard hood blade on the guard hood. Clamp the blade in a vise. Sharpen the blade with a flat file and make sure that the angle of the cutting edge is not altered in the process. File in one direction only.

7.5 Replacing the cutting line cover (Fig. 22)

If you need to replace the line safety guard (13), remove any screws if there are any, press the lugs (R) in and pull off the line safety guard. Press the lugs (R) on the new line safety guard (13) into the location holes provided.

7.6 Maintenance

There are no other parts inside the equipment which require maintenance.

8. Disposal and recycling

The equipment is supplied in packaging to prevent it from being damaged in transit. The raw materials in this packaging can be reused or recycled. The equipment and its accessories are made of various types of material, such as metal and plastic. Defective components must be disposed of as special waste. Ask your dealer or your local council.

9. Storage

Store the equipment and accessories in a dark and dry place at above freezing temperature. The ideal storage temperature is between 5 and 30 °C. Store the electric tool in its original packaging.

The equipment has an integrated wall holder (Fig. 23/Item L) to enable it to be hung on the wall.

10. Transport

- Always carry the tool with one hand on the handle and the other on the additional handle.
 Do not carry the tool by the motor housing.
- Secure the tool against slipping if transporting it by car.
- If possible, use the original packaging for transportation.
