








































Danger!

Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.

General safety information for power tools

The term "power tool" used in the safety information and instructions refers to power tools operated from the mains power supply (with a power cable) and to battery operated power tools (without a power cable).

- 1. Workplace safety
- Keep your work area clean and well lit.
 Untidy or unlit work areas can result in accidents.
- b) Do not use this power tool in an area where there is a risk of explosion and where there are inflammable liquids, gases or dust. Power tools generate sparks that can ignite dust or vapors.
- c) Keep children and other people away from the power tool while you are using it. If you are distracted you may lose control of the power tool.
- 2. Electrical safety
- a) The plug on the power tool must fit into the socket. The socket must not be modified in any way. Do not use adapter plugs together with power tools with a protective earth. Unmodified plugs and matching sockets will reduce the risk of an electric shock.
- b) Avoid body contact with earthed surfaces such as pipes, heating systems, stoves and refrigerators. There is an increased risk of suffering an electric shock if your body is earthed.
- c) Keep the power tool out of the rain and away from moisture. The ingress of water into an electric power tool increases the risk of an electric shock.
- d) Do not use the power cable for a purpose for which it is not designed, for example to carry the power tool, hang it up or to pull the plug out of the socket. Keep the power cable away from heat, oil, sharp edges and moving parts. Power cables that are damaged or tangled increase the risk of an electric shock.
- e) If you use an electric power tool outdoors, use only extension cables that are suitable for outdoor use. The use of an extension cable which is suitable for outdoor use reduces the risk of an electric shock.
- f) If you cannot avoid using the power tool in a damp location, use a residual current

device (RCD) circuit breaker. The use of a residual current device (RCD) circuit breaker will reduce the risk of suffering an electric shock.

- 3. Safety of persons
- a) Be careful, watch what you are doing and be sensible and responsible when using an electric power tool. Never use the power tool if you are tired or under the influence of drugs, alcohol or medication. One moment of inattention when using the electric tool can result in serious injuries.
- b) Wear personal safety equipment and always wear safety goggles. Wearing personal safety equipment such as dust masks, non-slip safety shoes, a helmet or ear plugs, depending on the type and application of the tool, reduces the risk of injury.
- c) Make sure that the tool cannot start up accidentally. Ensure that the power tool is switched off before you connect it to the power supply and/or connect the battery pack, pick it up or carry it. If you have your finger on the switch while carrying the power tool or if you connect the power tool to the power supply while it is switched on, this may cause accidents.
- d) Remove all adjusting tools or wrenches before you switch on the power tool. Any tool or wrench in a rotating part of the power tool could cause injuries.
- e) Avoid abnormal working postures. Make sure you stand squarely and keep your balance at all times. This will enable you to control the power tool better in unexpected situations.
- f) Wear suitable clothes. Never wear loose fitting clothes or jewelry. Keep hair and clothing away from moving parts. Loose clothing, jewelry or long hair can be caught by moving parts.
- g) If dust extraction devices and dust collection devices can be fitted, they must be connected and must be used correctly.

 The use of a dust extractor can reduce the dangers posed by dust.
- h) Do not allow yourself to be lulled into a false sense of security and do not ignore the safety regulations covering electric power tools, even if you are familiar with the power tool after having used it many times. Carelessness can lead to serious injuries in just a fraction of a second.

- 4. Using and handling the power tool
- a) Do not overload your power tool. Use the correct electric tool for the job in hand. The correct tool will enable you to work better and more safely within the specific performance range.
- b) Do not use an electric power tool if the switch is defective. An electric power tool that cannot be switched on or off is dangerous and must be repaired.
- c) Pull the plug out of the socket and/or remove the removable battery pack before making any adjustments to the tool, changing plug-in tool parts or putting the power tool down. These precautions will prevent the power tool starting accidentally.
- d) Keep unused electric tools out of the reach of children. Do not allow people who are not familiar with the power tool or who have not read these instructions to use the power tool. Electric tools are dangerous if they are used by inexperienced people.
- e) Look after power tools and plug-in tools with care. Check that moving parts function correctly and do not jam, and whether any parts are broken or damaged such that they adversely affect the function of the power tool. Have damaged parts repaired before you use the power tool. Many accidents are caused by poorly maintained electric tools.
- Keep cutting tools sharp and clean. Carefully maintained cutting tools with sharp cutting edges will jam less and are easier to control.
- g) Use the power tool, plug-in tools, etc. as set out in these instructions. Take account of the conditions in your work area and the job in hand. Using electric tools for purposes other than the one for which they are designed can result in dangerous situa-
- h) Keep the handles and grip surfaces dry, clean and free from oil and grease. If the handles and grip surfaces are slippery, it will not be possible to operate and control the power tool safely in unforeseen situations.
- 5. Service
- a) Have your power tool repaired only by trained personnel using only genuine spare parts. This will ensure that your power tool remains safe to use.

Hedge trimmer safety warnings:

- a) Keep all parts of the body away from the blade. Do not remove cut material or hold material to be cut when blades are moving. Blades continue to move after the switch is turned off. A moment of inattention while operating the hedge trimmer may result in serious personal injury.
- b) Carry the hedge trimmer by the handle with the blade stopped and taking care not to operate an power switch. Proper carrying of the hedge trimmer will decrease the risk of inadvertent starting and resultant personal injury from the blades.
- c) When transporting or storing the hedge trimmer, always fit the blade over. Proper handling of the hedge trimmer will decrease the risk of personal injury from the blades.
- d) When clearing jammed material or servicing the unit, make sure all power switches are off and the power cord is disconnected. Unexpected actuation of the hedge trimmer while clearing jammed material or servicing may result in serious personal injury.
- e) Hold the hedge trimmer by insulated gripping surfaces only, because the blade may contact hidden wiring or its own cord. Blades contacting a "live" wire may make exposed metal parts of the hedge trimmer "live" and could give the operator an electric shock.
- f) Keep all power cords and cables away from cutting area. Power cords or cables may be hidden in hedges or bushes and can be accidentally cut by the blade.
- g) Do not use the hedge trimmer in bad weather conditions, especially when there is a risk of lightning. This decreases the risk of being struck by lightning.

Pole hedge trimmer safety warnings:

- To reduce the risk of electrocution, never use the extended-reach hedge trimmer near any electrical power lines. Contact with or use near power lines may cause serious injury or electric shock resulting in death.
- b) Always use two hands when operating the extended-reach hedge trimmer. Hold the extended-reach hedge trimmer with both hands to avoid loss of control.
- Always use head protection when operating the extended-reach hedge trimmer overhead. Falling debris can result in serious personal injury.

Additional safety instructions

- It is recommended to search the hedges and bushes for hidden objects such as wire fencing and cables.
- To further reduce the danger of electric shock, we recommend that you use a residual current device (RCD) with a trip current of 30 mA or less.
- Hold the hedge trimmer correctly, for example with both hands if it is fitted with two handles.
- The hedge trimmer is designed for work which the user can do when standing on the ground and not on a ladder or any other unstable surface.
- Before the hedge trimmer is used it is recommended that the user makes sure that the locking devices for any moving parts provided (e.g. the extended shaft and the swivel component) are in the locked position.

 Damaged blades should only be replaced as pairs. If the trimmer is damaged by falling or impact, it must be inspected by a qualified person.
- Do not use the hedge trimmer if it has a damaged or excessively worn cutter.
- Ensure that all handles and protective equipment are properly fitted when you are using the hedge trimmer.

Important! This electric hedge trimmer is suitable for cutting hedges, bushes and shrubs.

Important! Do not use this tool to cut grass.

The equipment is to be used only for its prescribed purpose. Any other use is deemed to be a case of misuse. The user / operator and not the manufacturer will be liable for any damage or injuries of any kind caused as a result of this.

Please note that our equipment has not been designed for use in commercial, trade or industrial applications. Our warranty will be voided if the machine is used in commercial, trade or industrial businesses or for equivalent purposes.

- Have the appliance serviced whenever necessary.
- Switch the appliance off when it is not in use.
- Wear protective gloves.

Caution!

Residual risks

Even if you use this electric power tool in accordance with instructions, certain residual risks cannot be rules out. The following hazards may arise in connection with the equipment's construction and layout:

- Cut injuries are possible if no protective clothing is used.
- Lung damage if no suitable protective dust mask is used.

- Damage to hearing if no suitable ear protection is used.
- Health damage caused by hand-arm vibrations if the equipment is used over a prolonged period or is not properly guided and maintained.

5. Before starting the equipment

Before you connect the equipment to the mains supply make sure that the data on the rating plate are identical to the mains data.

Each day before use and after being dropped or suffering other types of impact, the tool must be examined for significant damage or defects.

Warning!

Always pull the power plug before making adjustments to the equipment.

Warning! The hedge trimmer must be fully assembled before you connect it to the power supply. To protect yourself against injury, always wear protective gloves when working on the hedge trimmer. Carefully unpack all parts and check that they are complete.

5.1 Fitting the extension tube and the hedge trimming unit

Depending on the height you need to reach, you can use the electric hedge trimmer with or without the extension tube (Fig. 2/Item 11).

5.1.1 Fitting the extension tube (Fig. 3a-3b)

- a) Slacken the fastening screw (Item 10) at the tube mount (Item 9) of the motor unit (Fig. 2/ Item 14).
- b) Insert the extension tube (Item 11) into the tube mount (Item 9) on the motor unit.
- c) Pull the spring-loaded bolt ring (Item 9b) and push the extension tube (Item 11) a distance of approx. 45 mm into the tube mount (Item 9). Let go of the spring-loaded bolt ring (Item 9b).
- d) Turn the extension tube (Item 11) until you hear the spring-loaded bolt (Item 9a) latch in the locking hole (Item 11a). To secure, tighten the fastening screw (Item 10) again.

5.1.2 Fitting the saw unit (Fig. 4)

To fit the saw unit (Fig. 2/Item 1) on the extension tube (Fig. 2/Item 11), proceed as described in section 5.1.1. Fig. 4 shows the saw unit when fully fitted.

To dismantle the extension tube and the saw unit, proceed in reverse order.

If you do not need the extension tube (Fig. 2/ Item 11), fit the saw unit (Fig. 2/Item 1) directly on the motor unit (Fig. 2/Item 14). Proceed with the fitting as described in section 5.1.1.

5.1.2 Fitting the hedge trimming unit (Fig. 4)

To fit the hedge trimming unit (Fig. 2/Item 1) on the extension tube (Fig. 2/Item 11), proceed as described in section 5.1.1. Fig. 4 shows the hedge trimming unit when fully fitted.

To dismantle the extension tube and the hedge trimming unit, proceed in reverse order.

If you do not need the extension tube (Fig. 2/ Item 11), fit the hedge trimming unit (Fig. 2/Item 1) directly on the motor unit (Fig. 2/Item 14). Proceed with the fitting as described in section 5.1.1.

5.2 Adjusting the angle of tilt (Fig. 5)

Important! Disconnect the power plug before you adjust the tilt angle.

Press up the safety lever (Item 20), grip the handle (Item 21) and press down the locking lever (Item 19). Tilt the hedge trimmer blade (Item 19) and release the safety lever (Item 20) when the required angle of tilt is reached. Make sure that the locking lever engages correctly on the saw blade crown (Item A).

Important! The gear unit can become hot during operation.

6. Operation

Please note that the statutory regulations governing noise abatement may differ from one location to another.

6.1 Using the shoulder strap

Warning! Always use a shoulder strap when working with the tool. Always switch off the tool before you release the should strap. Otherwise there is a risk of injury.

- Fig. 6: Attach the hooks (Item 5a) of the shoulder strap fastener to the harness holder (Item 17).
- Fig. 7: Place the shoulder strap (Item 5) over your shoulder and adjust the length of the

strap so that the strap holder is at waist level.

3. Important!

Fig. 8: The shoulder strap is equipped with a quick release. Press the hooks together (Item 5a) and pull the shoulder strap (Fig. 5) out of the harness holder if you need to put down the tool quickly.

6.2 Adjusting the handle (Fig. 9)

Important: Disconnect the power plug before you adjust the handle.

Push forward the release (Item 18) on the turning element (Item 8) and turn the handle (Item 4) to the required position (-90°/-45°/0°/45°/90°). Make sure that the lock release latches in place correctly!

6.3 Connecting to the power supply

- Connect the power cable to a suitable extension cable. Make sure that the extension cable is designed for the power rating of the electric hedge trimmer.
- Secure the extension cable (Item A) as shown in Fig. 10 to protect it against pulling forces and accidental disconnection.
- Connect the extension cable to a professionally installed safety mains socket with ground contact. We recommend using a cable with a bright and highly visible color (red or yellow). This will reduce the risk of accidentally damaging it with the electric hedge trimmer.

6.4 Switching On/Off (Fig. 9)

a) Switching on

- Hold the electric hedge trimmer firmly with one hand on the handle (Item 4) and the other hand on the grip area (Fig. 1/Item 2).
- Push forward the safety lock-off (Item 3) and press the On/Off switch (Item 7). Let go of the safety lock-off (Item 3).

b) Switching off

- Release the On/Off switch (Item 7).
- Always disconnect the mains plug when you stop working, even if it is only for a short time.

Check that the blades work properly and make sure that they come to a standstill.

7. Working with the electric hedge trimmer

- An electric hedge trimmer can be used to cut shrubs and bushes as well as hedges.
- The twin-bladed cutters rotate in opposite directions, thus enabling cutting in both directions (see Figure 11).
- It is recommended to tie a guide line along the hedge so that you cut the hedge to a level height. Cut off all branches which protrude beyond the guide line (see Figure 12).
- Cut the sides of the hedge with curve-shaped movements from the bottom up (see Figure 13)
- Be sure to comply with noise protection regulations and local ordinances. Use of the hedge trimmer may be restricted or prohibited on certain days (e.g. Sundays and holidays), at certain times of the day (midday, nighttime) or in particular areas (e.g. health resorts, clinics, etc.).
- When you are cutting, ensure that you do not come into contact with any objects such as wire fences or plant supports. This may damage the cutter bar.
- Firmly hold the hedge trimmer in both hands, with one hand on the rear handle and the other hand on the front handle. Your fingers and thumbs should be wrapped around the handles.
- If a solid object blocks the cutter, immediately switch off the hedge trimmer, disconnect the power plug and remove the object.
- Always continue moving away from the power outlet as you work. Decide on the direction of cut before you start working.
- Make sure that the extension cable stays out of the work area. Never route the cable over the hedge where it could easily by caught by the cutter blades.
- Avoid subjecting the hedge trimmer to excessive stress while you are working.
- Cutting hedges in the shape of a trapezoid is recommended to prevent the lower branches from going bare. This corresponds to natural plant growth and allows your hedge to flourish. If you only cut back the new seasonal shoots when you are trimming, you will have a dense hedge which provides good privacy.

8. Replacing the power cable Danger!

If the power cable for this equipment is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer or its after-sales service or similarly trained personnel to avoid danger.

Cleaning, maintenance and ordering of spare parts

Danger!

Always pull out the mains power plug before starting any cleaning work.

9.1 Cleaning

- Keep all safety devices, air vents and the motor housing free of dirt and dust as far as possible. Wipe the equipment with a clean cloth or blow it with compressed air at low pressure.
- We recommend that you clean the device immediately each time you have finished using it.
- Clean the equipment regularly with a moist cloth and some soft soap. Do not use cleaning agents or solvents; these could attack the plastic parts of the equipment. Ensure that no water can seep into the device. The ingress of water into an electric tool increases the risk of an electric shock.

9.2 Carbon brushes

In case of excessive sparking, have the carbon brushes checked only by a qualified electrician. **Danger!** The carbon brushes should not be rep laced by anyone but a qualified electrician.

9.3 Maintenance

- To ensure best performance at all times you should clean and lubricate the blades when the job is finished or as and when required.
 Remove deposits with a brush and apply a thin film of oil (see Fig. 14).
- Clean all parts of the tilt angle adjuster (Fig. 5)
 when the job is finished or as and when required. Remove deposits with a brush and keep
 all moving parts running smoothly by then
 applying a thin film of oil.
- There are no other parts inside the tool which require maintenance.

9.4 Ordering replacement parts:

10. Faults

The tool does not work:

Check that the power cable is connected properly and check the mains fuses. If the tool will not work in spite of the voltage supply being OK, please send it to the customer service address provided.

11. Disposal and recycling

The equipment is supplied in packaging to prevent it from being damaged in transit. The raw materials in this packaging can be reused or recycled. The equipment and its accessories are made of various types of material, such as metal and plastic. Never place defective equipment in your household refuse. The equipment should be taken to a suitable collection center for proper disposal. If you do not know the whereabouts of such a collection point, you should ask in your local council offices.

12. Storage and transportation

- Store the tool and its accessories out of the reach of children in a dark and dry place at above freezing temperature. The ideal storage temperature is between 5 and 30°C.
- Always hold the tool with one hand on the main handle and the other hand on the additional handle.
- Do not carry the tool by its motor housing.
- Secure the tool against slipping if you transport it in a vehicle.
- If possible, use the original packaging for transporting the tool.
- Clean the electric hedge trimmer and carry out its maintenance before you put it into storage.
- During storage or transportation, use the supplied safety guard for the hedge trimmer blade.
